Each of 7 easily portable display stands extends out from its own base to 6 feet high by 3 feet wide. Arrange them any way that fits your space.

Each side of each panel contains a different spectacular space image accompanied by a simple explanation in both English and Spanish.



Why?

During 2009—the 400th anniversary of Galileo’s first use of the telescope—the world celebrated the International Year of Astronomy. Thousands of people in northern California saw this small traveling exhibit, which was just one of NASA’s many outreach programs. It was so popular that a consortium of NASA Education and Public Outreach groups, primarily based at NASA’s Ames Research Center in Mountain View, has decided to continue to circulate the exhibit during 2010.

How?

You may schedule the display for anywhere from two days to two weeks. Within the greater San Francisco Bay Area, NASA will deliver the display to you and pick it up. There is no charge for any of this. You are asked to provide a small table for handouts and to make reasonable efforts to protect the display from damage. Free transportation may also be available outside the Bay Area. Call the contact person below for more information.

NASA will also provide small informational handouts from the space missions which provided the images and the display. And NASA *may* even be able to provide an astronomer to speak before your visitors or students.
